

Boyd County Band Boosters Association

Constitution

Article I – Name

The name of the organization shall be “Boyd County Band Boosters Association.”

Article II – Objectives

1. The primary objective is to provide financial aid for the Band programs.
2. To assist the Director of the Boyd County High School Band and students who participate in the high school marching, concert, and jazz bands by:
 - Furnishing supplies and aid as needed that is not otherwise supplied by the school board.
 - Providing funds for the band to attend festivals and other related band activities.
 - Providing financial assistance for those students deemed necessary by the Band Director without giving the name of the student to the Association, guaranteeing student privacy.
3. The association shall in no way seek to supersede, dictate, direct, or circumvent school activities or policies.

Article III – Eligibility

1. All active members shall be parents, foster parents, grandparents, or guardians of band students of Boyd County Band Programs, or any other interested volunteers who wish to participate in order to further music education.
2. The Boyd County Board of Education will be invited to name one member to attend our regular meetings in an advisory capacity.

Article IV – Officers

1. The officers of this association shall consist of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
2. The principal of Boyd County High School shall be an ex-official member of this association and have voting posers at all meetings.
3. The Secretary of this Association shall record the minutes of all regular and special meetings and keep on file a minute book of the Association. The members will approve the minutes during the regular meetings.
4. The treasurer of the Association shall be responsible for the accounting of all funds of the Association and for rendering a regular monthly report at each meeting.

Article V – Governing Rules

Roberts Rules of Order shall be the rule and guide of this Association insofar as they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-laws of the Association or with any special rules of order.
